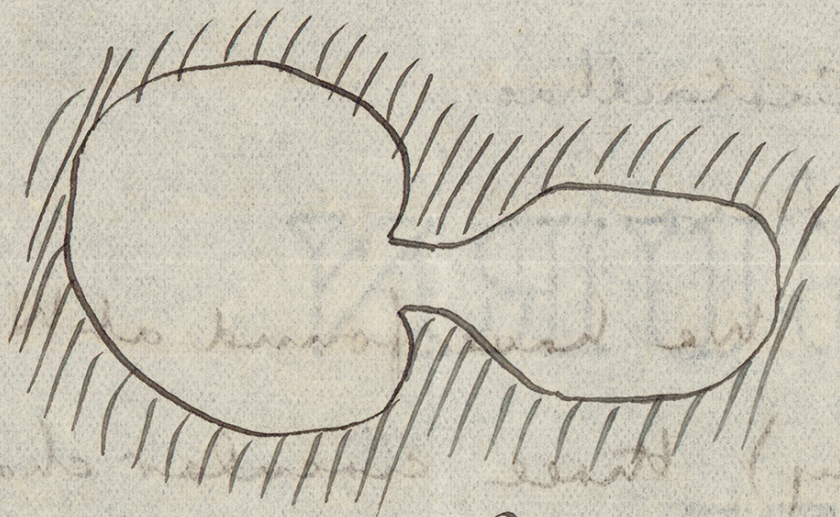
Dear Sir,

We have found at Waddon
(Surrey) three circular chambers
very much like those you described
in Matériaux (1885, page 1-18)
at Palmella. Each chamber
is about 15 feet below the surface
of the ground, and shows the
peculiarity of plan to which you

draw attention in your interesting paper. The part near the doorway is thickened in this way:-



We have found Romano-British pottery in the floors of the chambers, but no human sepulchral remains. I should be much obliged if you would kindly let me know whether

you know of any other examples
in France or elsewhere.

I think the chambers at
Waddon are certainly of
the neolithic age and were
probably used partly for
habitation (when the weather
was very hot or very cold),
and also for sepulchral
purposes.
