My dear M. Cartailhac

Your valuable work on
the Grotte de Vailhac reached me
safely, and I am extremely obliged
to you for it, as also for the book on
Deneholes. I have not yet had
time to read the Grotte de Vailhac
but am looking forward to doing
so shortly.

I sent a postcard to acknow-
ledge the receipt of the parcel, and
I now have the pleasure of sending

by bookpost the map which I promised to make, showing the localities of the circles in Britain.

The map I have taken out of Bradshaw's Railway Guide, as the most convenient I could get, and the ^{printed} figures upon it against the various railway lines refer to the pages in the guide where the times of the trains (and sometimes the prices) are to be found, so I send you the book as well, in case you should like to plan out a tour for yourself at any time.

I hope the list will be of use to you, although it is not quite perfect. Scotland in particular is not

complete.

The Orkney Isles are not shown on the map, but they contain the great circle at Stennis, and the celebrated chamber of Maeshowe.

Ireland I have not attempted to touch, as I do not know enough about it.

In South Wales there are perhaps half a dozen dolmens (not possessing any very peculiar characteristics), but, not having been in that district, I do not know their exact whereabouts, and have not attempted to put them in.

With these exceptions I think I have noted everything larger than a mere cist, but there are

districts, such as Dartmoor and the Lands End, which I have been obliged to generalise, because this map is not on a sufficiently large scale to show each monument separately. Perhaps I may be able later on to send you maps of these districts showing the different remains more precisely.

I just see that I have done nothing for Jersey, Guernsey, &c., but they want a larger map.

If you draw a line from Hamborough Head in Yorkshire to the Isle of Wight you will find nothing to the east of it except the little group in Kent - *Trincomalee House &c*

I hope you have been well since your return home, and that neither you nor yours will have influenza. We, I am happy to say, are all well, and we join in best regards and good wishes for the new year.

I should mention that nearly all the places I have marked on the map have been described by me in the Journal of the Anthropological Institute, &c, which I believe you have, but I could send you descriptions of any which you may not have. Yours Very Truly,
