I take the liberty of asking if you would kindly tell me if you know of any moulds for casting flat bronze axes having been found in France or in Spain. By flat axes I mean the simple wedge-shaped flat axe without wings or flanges.

I am preparing a paper, for the Soc. of Antiquaries of Scotland, about a stone mould for flat bronze axes (No V on enclosed table) which I have been fortunate to get. I am trying to make as complete a list as possible of

from Britain and the continent
and I shall be much indebted
to you for any information
you may be able to give me.

I know of two having
been found in France; one is
mentioned by Dr Chantre - Aye
du Bronze, and it was found
at Plouharnel, Quiberon Lorient
Morbihan, the other mentioned
in *Matériaux pour l'histoire de
l'Homme* vol XXII p 158 comes
from Molitg-les Bains Pyrénées-
Orientales. If you can add to
this number both as regards
France and Spain you might
please say if they are referred
to in any book so that I may

be able to quote it as a
reference.
