man and infant and the  
words SANCTUS JOSEPH-  
ORA PRO NOBIS. On the  
other side, stamped in the  
same way, is an Agnus (or  
Lamb) bearing the usual small  
flag or pennon, with the words  
ECCE AGNUS DEI QUI TOLLET,  
PECCATA MUNDI, and ROMA under-

neath. The base is, <sup>that of,</sup> a "Passion"  
Cross of three steps.

I bought this article  
many years ago at the sale  
of the properties of a Catholic  
family whose name was not  
disclosed, and therefore nothing  
of its history is at present  
known. If it would be of  
any interest to the Society, by  
way of comparison, I should  
be glad to get it photographed  
and a copy sent to you.
