Your kind words about our Memoirs and what you write about
Professor Tozzer's Report on Nakum are most pleasing to me. We
hope soon to publish another Memoir giving results of a later expedition to Central America including some interesting discoveries, but
I suppose it will be about a year before you will receive your copy.
The expedition has not yet returned from the field.

In regard to your question about the work on the neolithic implements of North America, I am sorry to have to state that while many papers have been written giving description of many forms of weapons, implements and ornaments made of stone, copper, meteoric iron, bone, horn and shell; prehistoric pottery, basketry and textiles, there has not been a work published covering the subject as a whole. The nearest approach to this is a work by W.K.Moorehead, entitled The Stone Age in North America, in two volumes, octavo (Boston, Mass., Houghton & Mifflin Co., 1910)

This work contains many illustrations of objects in stone with descriptions. It is in many ways an important work, although of a popular character. Some time I hope we shall have a work covering the whole immense subject.
