Dear Monsieur Cartailhac,

My wife and I feel that we must send you a few lines to thank you for your extreme kindness and courtesy to us during our visit to France. My brother-in-law and his wife also wish to express their gratitude. From the moment we arrived at Perigueux we found ourselves under your protection, without which we should have seen and learnt comparatively little.

I am sending you by the same post the New Guinea reprints and a reprint concerning the quartz implements from Ceylon. I am sorry I have not been able to find any of the implements themselves, as I think I told you we have just moved into a new house and things are still somewhat in disorder. The New Guinea book will be sent to you directly to the Museum. The Vedda lantern slides have been ordered, these will take a week or ten days to make. With these I will return ~~xxxxxx~~ those that you so kindly lent me. They were very much appreciated at my lecture and a similar set will be most useful for teaching purposes.

I will write to you about the three or four ethnographica
