kind enough to give a sum-
mary the other evening,
I shall have translated
& sent to you for publi-
cation in the proceedings
of the Congress, if thoughts
worthy of being printed. I
have advised Mr. Mon-
trellet to the same effect.

I believe the Congress
will have a good influence,
& if so it will be due
to no one more than
yourself.
